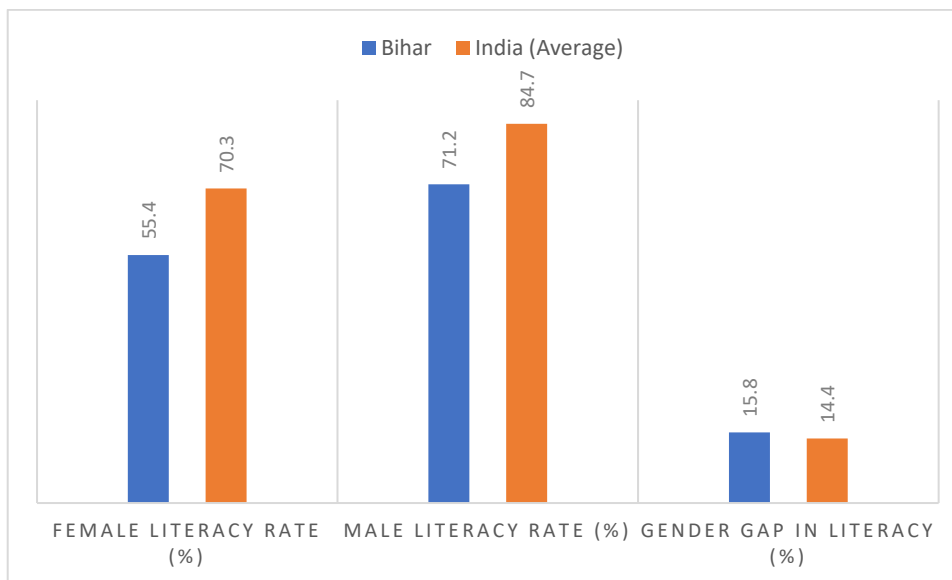
### 2. Current State of Women's Education in Bihar

Bihar has historically lagged in educational achievements, especially for women. According to the National Family Health Survey-5 (NFHS-5, 2020-21), the literacy rate among women in Bihar is 55.4%, compared to the national average of 70.3% .

**Table 1:** The table shows the literacy rate in female and male and also shows the gender gap in literacy



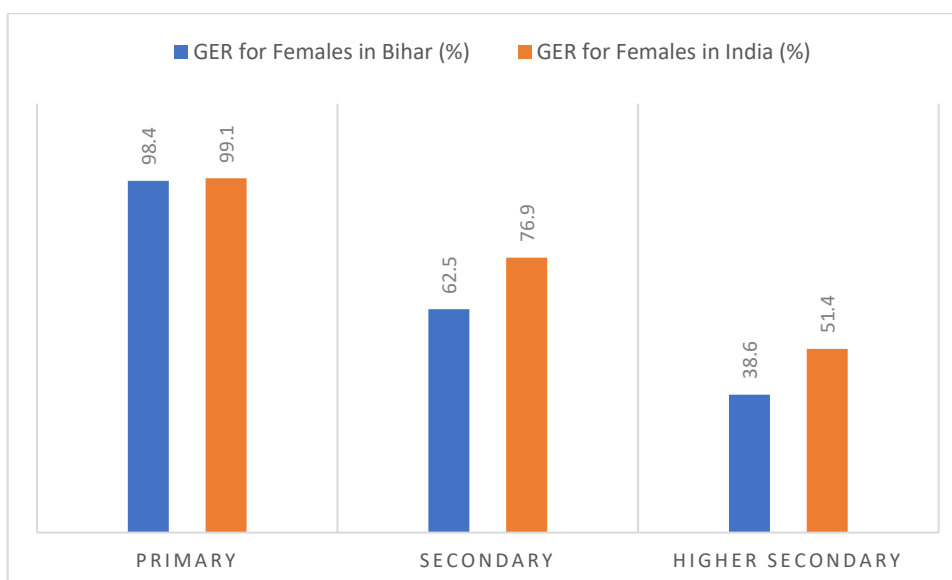
**Fig1:** The graph shows the literacy rate in female and male and also shows the gender gap in literacy

### 2.2. Enrolment Rates

Despite improvements, the enrolment of girls in secondary and higher education remains low. The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) for females at the secondary level in Bihar is 62.5%, which is below the national average of 76.9% .
